Boundaries	<p>As to for and concerning the boundaries of the said parish of Foxton We the said commissioners have by the examination of witnesses upon oath and by other legal ways and means inquired into the boundaries of the said parish of Foxton between the said parish of Foxton and the parishes of Newton Thriplow and Foulmire in the said County of Cambridge and have ascertained set out determined and fixed And do hereby award and confirm the same as hereinafter described that is to say, commencing at the Brook where the parishes of Harston Newton and Foxton unite and proceeding north eastwardly along the boundary line between Harston and Foxton to the top of the first furlong then south east along a headland to the north east corner of half an acre of land belonging to Seagrave Faircloth in the parish of Newton then southwestwardly along the north west side of the said half acre to the centre of the brook then south eastwardly in an irregular line along the centre of the said brook to the south west corner of Newton Pen then north eastwardly along a drain and the centre of a baulk or hedgerow on the north west side and to the north east corner of the said Pen then south eastwardly along the north east side of the said Pen to the said brook then eastwardly in an irregular line along the centre of the said brook to the north west corner of an osier holt belonging to Christopher Pemberton Esquire in Newton thence along the south west and south east sides of the said osier holt to the south east corner thereof thence along the centre of a ditch in a southwardly direction on the east side of Poles Pen and the end of Chadwell shot to the north corner of Fir Pen thence south eastwardly along the bottom of Fir Pen and Row Ditch Furlong to Newton Collin Baulk thence north eastwardly along the north west side of the said baulk to the corner of the headland at the north east end of the said baulk then south eastwardly and eastwardly along the said headland to the east end thereof then south eastwardly about thirteen yards to a common baulk then north eastwardly along a headland at the end of two pieces of land belonging to Christopher Pemberton and Allen Samuel respectively to the north east end thereof then south eastwardly along another headland to and continuing to the centre of the Turnpike Road leading from London through Foulmire to Cambridge where the several parishes of Foxton Newton and Thriplow unite thence south westwardly along the centre of the said Turnpike Road to a point opposite Triplow Bank thence north westwardly to the said bank and south westwardly along the centre thereof to the south corner of Chadwell Field in Foxton aforesaid then south eastwardly to and along the end of a piece of open field land called Brand's Close belonging to St. John's College to the east corner thereof thence south westwardly along the side of the said Close to and across an ancient lane or road way leading into Hill Field in the said parish of Foxton and continuing south westwardly along the south east side of an ancient inclosure called Brand's Close belonging to the said College to the brook where the several parishes of Foxton Thriplow and Foulmire unite thence north westwardly in an irregular line along the centre of the // said brook to the point where the several parishes of Foxton Foulmire and Shepreth unite</p>

Roads	And We the said commissioners in further pursuance of the directions of the said Act have set out and appointed and do hereby award and confirm the following public carriage roads and highways private carriage road and footways through and over the lands and grounds by the said act directed to be divided and allotted that is to say
Shepreth Road	One public Carriage Road and Highway called the Shepreth Road of the breadth of forty feet commencing at the west end of the village of Foxton and proceeding in westwardly and north westwardly directions till it enters the Turnpike Road at or near Shepreth Bridge
Foulmire Road	One other public Carriage Road and Highway called the Foulmire Road of the breadth of forty feet commencing at the north east end of the village of Foxton and proceeding south eastwardly in a straight line across Chadwell Field and Hill Field till it enters the parish of Triplow at the south corner of Chadwell Field
Stocker's Lane Road	One other public Carriage Road and Highway called the Stocker's Lane Road of the breadth of forty feet commencing at the north end of Stocker's Lane in Foxton aforesaid and proceeding northwardly to the Turnpike Road from Royston to Cambridge
Barrington Road	And one other public Carriage Road and Highway called the Barrington Road of the breadth of thirty feet commencing at the Turnpike road from Royston to Cambridge opposite the end of Stocker's Lane Road and proceeding in northward westward and northward directions across Hopper Field Home Field and Ham Meadow to Barrington Mill
	And we the said commissioners have set out the Turnpike Road leading from Royston to Cambridge of the breadth of thirty feet on each side from the middle or centre thereof and a moiety of the Turnpike Road leading from London through Foulmire to Cambridge of the breadth of thirty feet from the centre thereof the other moiety thereof being in the parish of Triplow
Private Road	One Private carriage and occupation Road of the breadth of twenty feet commencing at the Shepreth Road on the north west corner of an ancient inclosure belonging to Clare Hall College and proceeding by the side of the said ancient inclosure and another ancient inclosure allotted in exchange to William Elborne to the Town Drain thence southwardly by the side of the said drain to an ancient inclosure called Baldwyn's Close belonging to Clare Hall College aforesaid
	And we do hereby order direct and award that the said private road hereinbefore described is set out for the use and convenience of the owners and occupiers of land and estates adjoining thereto and that the same shall be maintained and kept in repair as follows that is to say from the Shepreth Road to the north corner of the allotment to Ann Eversden adjoining the said road by and at the expense of the owners and occupiers of the said allotment for the time being and from thence to the said ancient inclosure called Baldwyn's Close by and at the expense of the owners and occupiers of the said close for the time being
Public Footway to Harston	One public Footway of the breadth of four feet commencing at the Town Street in the village of Foxton aforesaid and proceeding along Pound Lane and by the side of Bury Close and continuing in a north westwardly direction over an allotment to John Bendyshe Esquire in Hopper Field to the Turnpike road from Royston to Cambridge //

To Newton	One other other public Footway of the width of four feet commencing at the Foulmire road at the south corner of the allotment to Edward Kimpton and proceeding north eastwardly over an allotment to the said John Bendyshe in Chadwell Field to the brook dividing the parish of Foxton and Newton at the east corner of Newton pen Moor
To Foulmire	And one other public Footpath of the breadth of four feet commencing at the south end of a lane between ancient inclosures belonging to Messieurs Steward Cotton and Company and William Hurrell Esquire and proceeding south westwardly to the fence dividing the allotments of the said William Hurrell and William Salmon in Hill field thence south eastwardly by the side of the said fence and continuing southeastwardly and southwardly over allotments to the said William Hurrell and James Banks to a foot bridge over the Foulmire Brook into the parish of Foulmire
	And we do hereby order and direct that proper and convenient stiles shall be set and kept in repair in the fences and that footbridges shall be laid and kept in repair over the brooks watercourses and ditches which the said footpaths respectively pass over by and at the expence of the owners of such fences and ditches
	And we do hereby award order and direct that the grass and herbage growing and arising upon the said several herein before described public roads shall for ever belong to and be the sole right of the Proprietors for the time being of the respective lands and allotments next adjoining to the said roads on either side thereof as far as the crown or middle of the said roads respectively and that the grass and herbage growing and arising upon the said several footways shall for ever belong to and be the sole right of the Proprietors for the time being of the respective Lands and allotments over which the same pass and that the grass and herbage growing and arising upon the said hereinbefore described private road shall for ever belong to and be the sole right of the Proprietor or Proprietors for the time being of the allotments hereinafter Awarded to Ann Eversden
	And in further pursuance of the powers and authorities to us given in and by the said Act in that behalf We the said Commissioners have by and with the concurrence and order of two of His Majesty's Justices of the Peace in and for the said County of Cambridge as by the said recited Acts is required stopt up and discontinued the several ancient public roads lanes and footpaths hereinafter mentioned that is to say
No1	One ancient lane called Pound Lane leading out of the Town Street into Hopper Field
No2	One other ancient lane leading out of the Town Street aforesaid near the east end of the village of Foxton aforesaid opposite a cottage and homestead belonging to John Caldecoat into Hill Field
No3	One other ancient lane called Baker's Lane leading out of the Street of Foxton aforesaid at a homestead belonging to Sarah Whittingstall into Hopper Field
No4	One other ancient lane called Jenkins's Lane leading out of Town Street opposite a farm homestead called Welbore's into Hill Field
No5	One other ancient lane called the Back Lane from the south end of Jenkins's Lane to the Black Boy Public House
No6	And one other ancient lane called Coneygate Lane from the Shepreth road on the west side of the homestead belonging to William Elborne into Hill Field //
No 7	One ancient footpath across Bury Close belonging to John Bendyshe Esquire from the north end of Pound Lane into Hopper Field at the south east corner of Whyntott's Close

No 8	One other ancient footpath from Mortimer's farm homestead northwardly over ancient inclosures of the said John Bendyshe to Vine Lane Balk in Hopper Field
No 9	One other ancient footpath from the same farm homestead westwardly over the said ancient inclosures to Hopper Field near the north end of Baker's Lane
No 10	One other ancient footpath on the north side of Clunch Pit Close belonging to the said John Bendyshe leading into Mortimer's Corner in Chadwell Field
No 11	One other ancient footpath from the homestead of Richard Miller over sundry ancient inclosures belonging to the said John Bendyshe the Dean and Chapter of Ely and William Hurrell Esquire to the Town Street at the north end of Jenkins's Lane
No 12	One other ancient footpath from the said homestead of Richard Miller over (Power's) Close belonging to the said John Bendyshe to the Church Yard

Public Drains	And We the said Commissioners have set out and appointed and do hereby award and confirm the several following public drains that is to say
No1	One public drain or watercourse commencing at the Foulmire Brook at or near the point where the parishes of Foulmire and Shepreth unite and proceeding northwestwardly over Flag Pightle to and by the north east side of Baldwyn's Closes thence between Hill Field and Hopper Field and on the East side of Coneygate Close to and between ancient inclosures to Foxton Green thence over the said Green in its present channel or course by the side of the Town Street of Foxton aforesaid to Baker's Lane and along the west side of the said lane and along the north side of the farm homestead of Sarah Whittingstall and ancient inclosures belonging to James Banks and Jeremiah Brock thence southwardly to Mortimer's Lane and eastwardly to the mote or pond at Mortimer's Homestead.

	And we do hereby order and direct that one moiety of all such public drains as form the boundaries between the said parish of Foxton and any adjoining parish and the whole of all such of the said several public drains as are wholly situate in the said parish of Foxton shall for ever hereafter when and as often as necessary be cleansed scoured and maintained of such widths depths and dimensions as shall hereafter appear necessary to the surveyor or surveyors for the time being of the highways within the said parish at the expence of the respective persons who for the time being are bound by law to repair the highways within the said parish
	And we do hereby further order and direct that the said Surveyors of the Highways shall have liberty to lay the earth or soil which shall be collected or (thrown) out by such scouring or clearing upon any of the lands or grounds adjoining the said drains or watercourses as shall be requisite without being liable to any action or suit for so doing so as no wilful or voluntary damage be done to the said lands or grounds or as little as the nature of the case will admit of
Allotment for a Public Chalk Pit 1a	And we the said Commissioners have set out and allotted and do hereby award and confirm as and for a Public Sand Gravel Stone or Chalk Pit to be used by the Surveyor or Surveyors of the Highways for the time being of the said Parish of Foxton for the repairs of the Public Roads in the said Parish and by the owners and occupiers of Lands and hereditaments within the said Parish only. One plot of land in Hill Field containing one acre with a right of way of the breadth of twenty feet to the Foulmire Road through and along the South East side of an allotment to James Banks bounded on the North West and North East by the said allotment to James Banks on the South East by an allotment to Edward Scott and on the South West by an allotment to the Dean and Chapter of Ely the fences of which said allotment on the north east and south east sides thereof shall be made and maintained by the Surveyor or Surveyors of the Highways in the parish of Foxton for the time being
